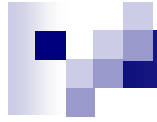
What is Compendium-PE?

- PE = Portability Enhanced
 - Compendium plus some new functions to allow mapping anywhere, even if you're not at your desk!
- Allows access to a personal copy of all maps in the project when away from your office (not connected to the LAN or VPN)
- Allows you to merge any work you do on those maps back into the shared project when you return to the office LAN or connect through the VPN
 - Similar to Lotus Notes Offline / Online (“on the road”) feature



New Terminology in C-PE

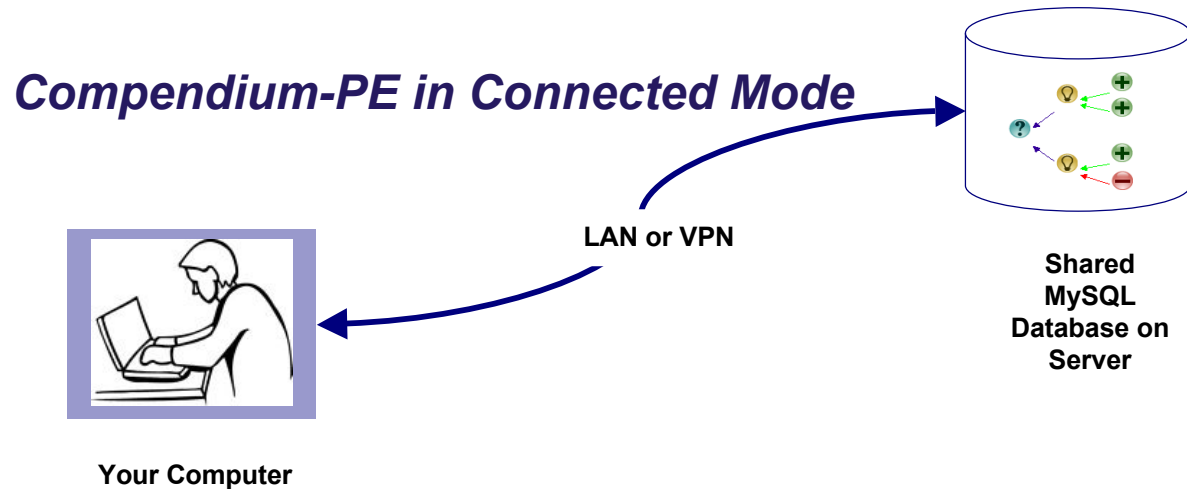
- Three new terms
 - **Connected Mode**
 - Related words: shared (MySQL) Database
 - **Remote Mode**
 - Related words: personal copy (Derby) Database
 - **Sync** (Synchronization or Synchronize)
- You will work in either Connected Mode or Remote Mode
- Sync is how you get information from one database to the other



New Terminology in C-PE

- The next three slides provide an overview of this new terminology... with pictures!

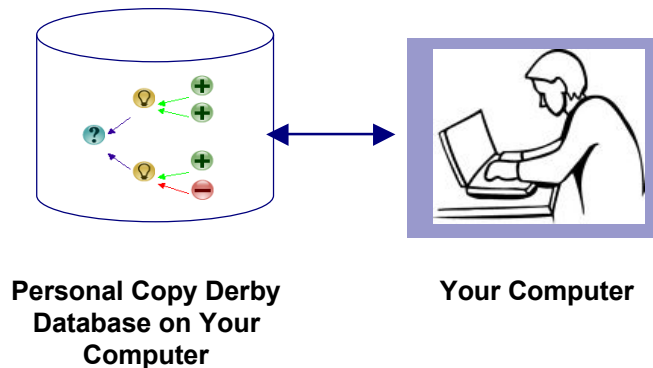
C-PE: Connected Mode Picture



- Connected Mode is another way of saying “the way you’ve always used Compendium”
- In Connected Mode, the shared (MySQL) database is located on a server
 - This shared database may also be called a master database
- A LAN or VPN network connection is required for Connected Mode to work

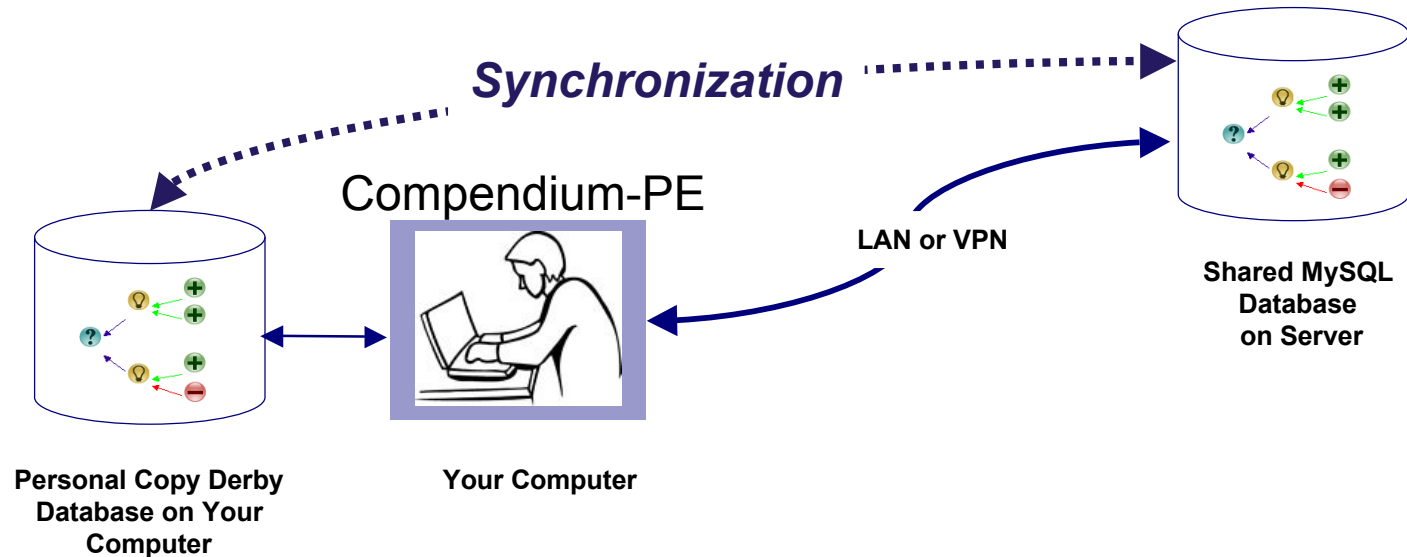
C-PE: Remote Mode Picture

Compendium-PE in Remote Mode

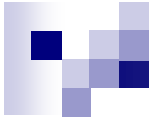


- Remote Mode is new – it makes Compendium “portable”
- In Remote Mode, the personal copy (Derby) database is located on your computer
- Remote Mode will work even if you have no LAN or VPN network connection

C-PE: Synchronization Picture



- Synchronization is the process used by Compendium-PE to make sure that the personal copy database on your computer and the shared database on the server have the same information in them.

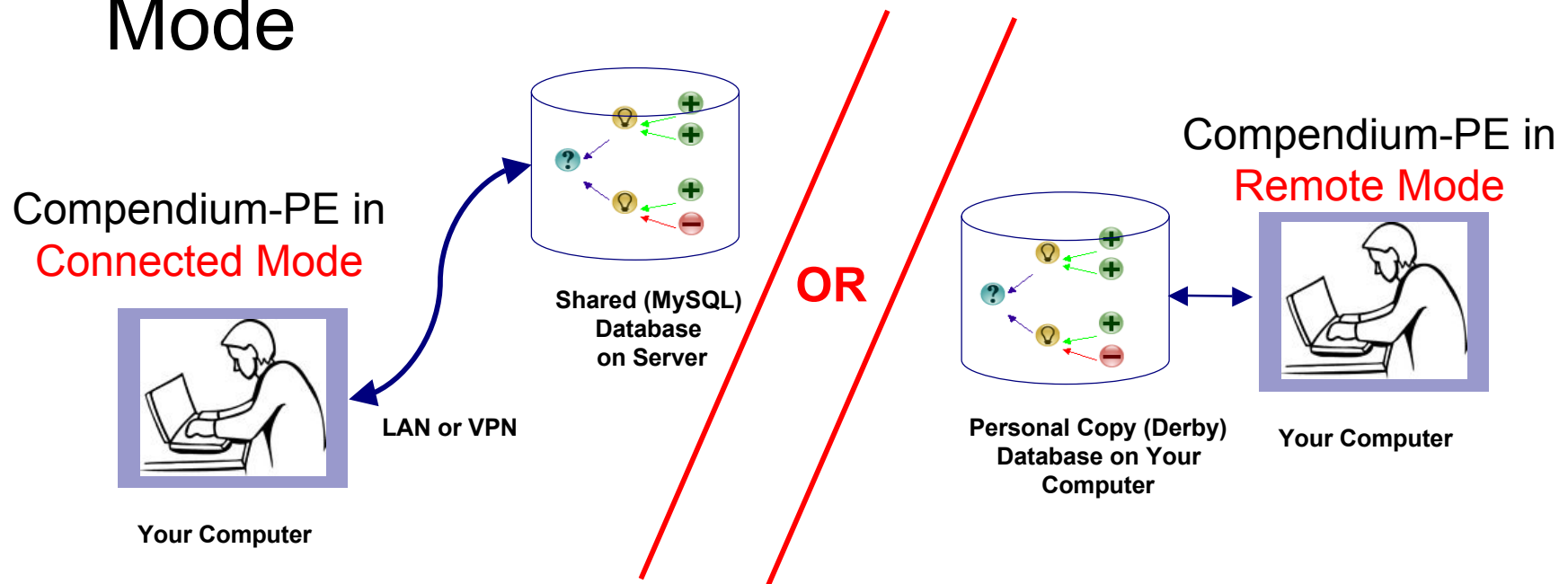

Choosing Your Working Mode

- When you start to use C-PE, the first step is to choose whether you want to work in Connected Mode or Remote Mode





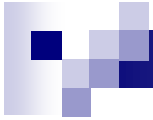
Choosing Your Working Mode - cont.

- In Connected Mode things work ‘normally’ ... you are directly connected to the shared database (master database)
 - **Pro:** Any mapping that you or others do appears on everyone’s screen within a few moments without requiring any special action
 - **Pro:** Any Cmails you send, or that others send you, arrive in their destination Inbox within a few moments
 - **Con:** If the network connection is slow, then Compendium is slow! Sometimes too slow to be useable.



Choosing Your Working Mode - cont.

- In Remote Mode you have ‘cut the cord’ to the shared database (master database)
 - **Pro:** You can do your mapping at high speed even with a poor connection or if you are off the network
 - **Con:** The mapping work you do, and any Cmail you send, isn’t seen by others until you Synchronize
 - **Con:** The mapping work others do, and any Cmail they send you, isn’t seen by you until you Synchronize
 - **Con:** If you forget to Synchronize, for others, *it is like the work you did never happened!*



Living in a Bi-modal World

- Remember...
 - Working in Remote Mode is like editing a Word document while you're on a plane flight... all that thinking is locked inside your computer until you make it available to others... using Sync!



Living in a Bi-modal World - cont.

■ Also...

- It's easy to forget to Sync
 - BTW, helping with or automating this is on the “possible future features” list!
- Here are some signs that someone might have forgotten to sync
 - You get a Compendium Inbox email, but there's no corresponding Cmail
 - You send someone a Cmail to some nodes you added to a map, and when you check with them they say they can't find the nodes or the Cmail
 - You do some mapping while you are on a trip, and when you get back to the office ... the work you did is gone!
- **When in doubt, sync!**

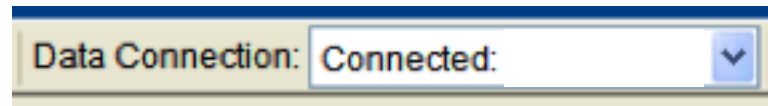


Starting Connected Mode


- Normal mode when at your desk
 - Because you can immediately see changes made by others
 - Because there will be less confusion about state of the maps
- To start, close C-PE, if it is open
- Verify that you have a LAN or VPN connection

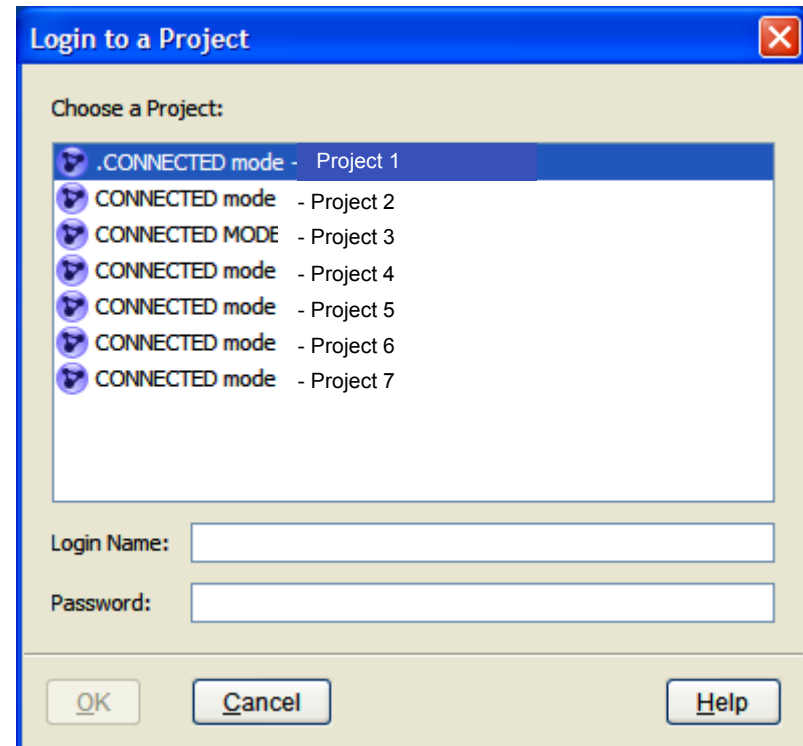
Starting Connected Mode - cont.

- Open C-PE
- If the Login to a Project list starts with “REMOTE...”, click on [Cancel]
- Change the Data Connection to “Connected:<your connection ID>”
 - You will find this at the bottom of your screen



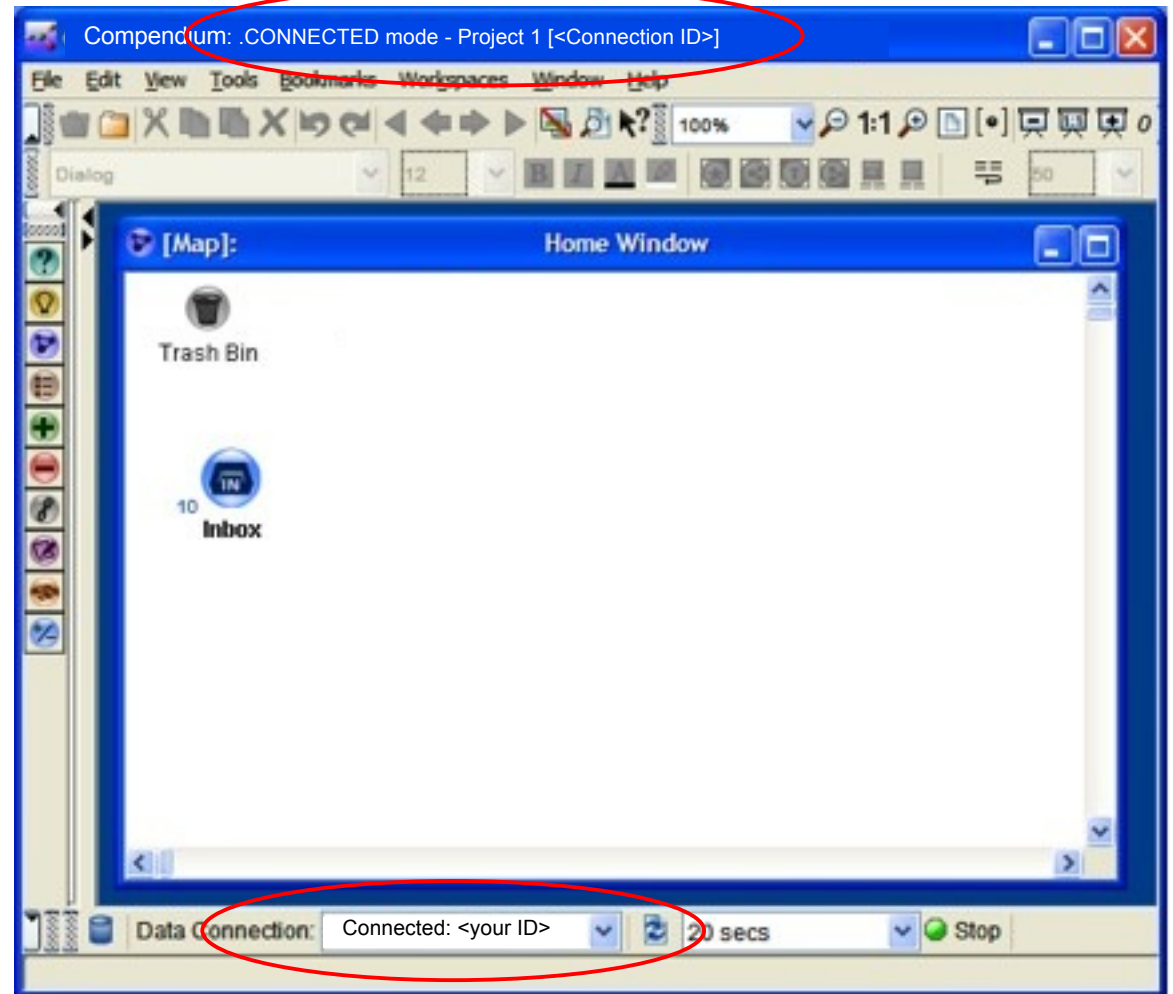
Starting Connected Mode - cont.

- This dialog will be displayed 
 - If it is not, go to the File menu and select Open
- Select the CONNECTED Mode project that you want to open and login as usual.



Using Connected Mode:

- Title will read **Compendium: CONNECTED mode - <project name>**
- Data Connection will be **Connected:<Connection ID>**
- Compendium will operate normally, using the shared database (MySQL database)



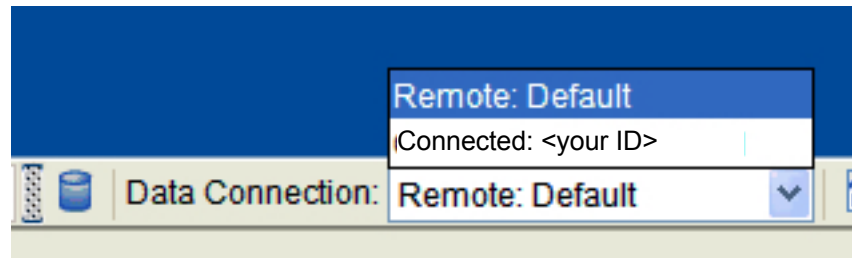


Starting Remote Mode

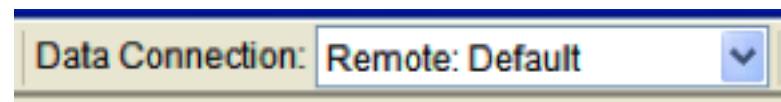
- Normal mode when away from your desk or away from the office
 - Because you can use it when you don't have any access to the shared database
 - Because you can use it when the network connection available is slow
- To start, close C-PE, if it is open

Starting Remote Mode - cont

- Open C-PE
- If the Login to a Project list has projects starting with “CONNECTED...”, click on [Cancel]
- Change the Data Connection to “Remote: Default”

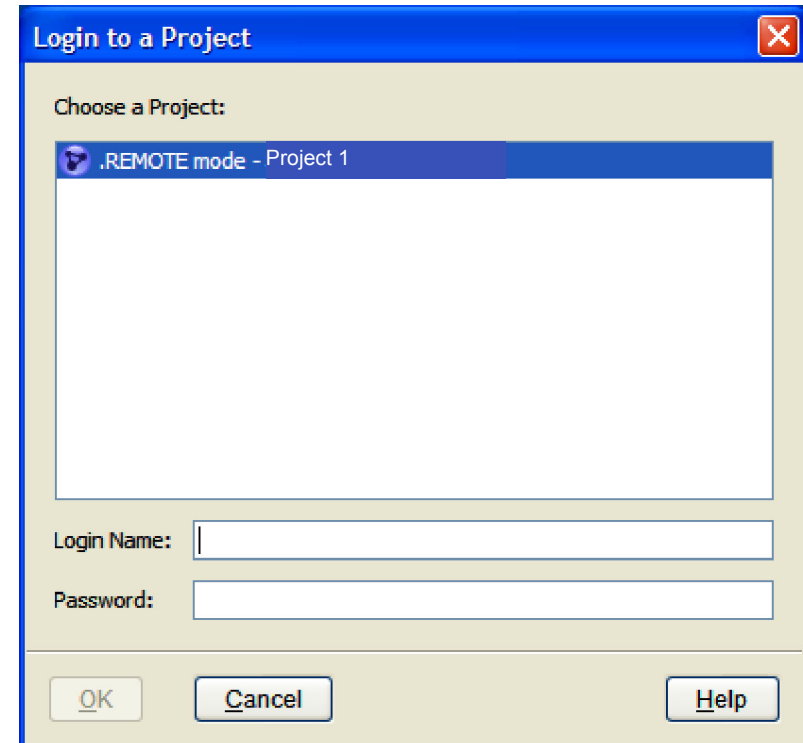


- You will then see this at the bottom of your screen



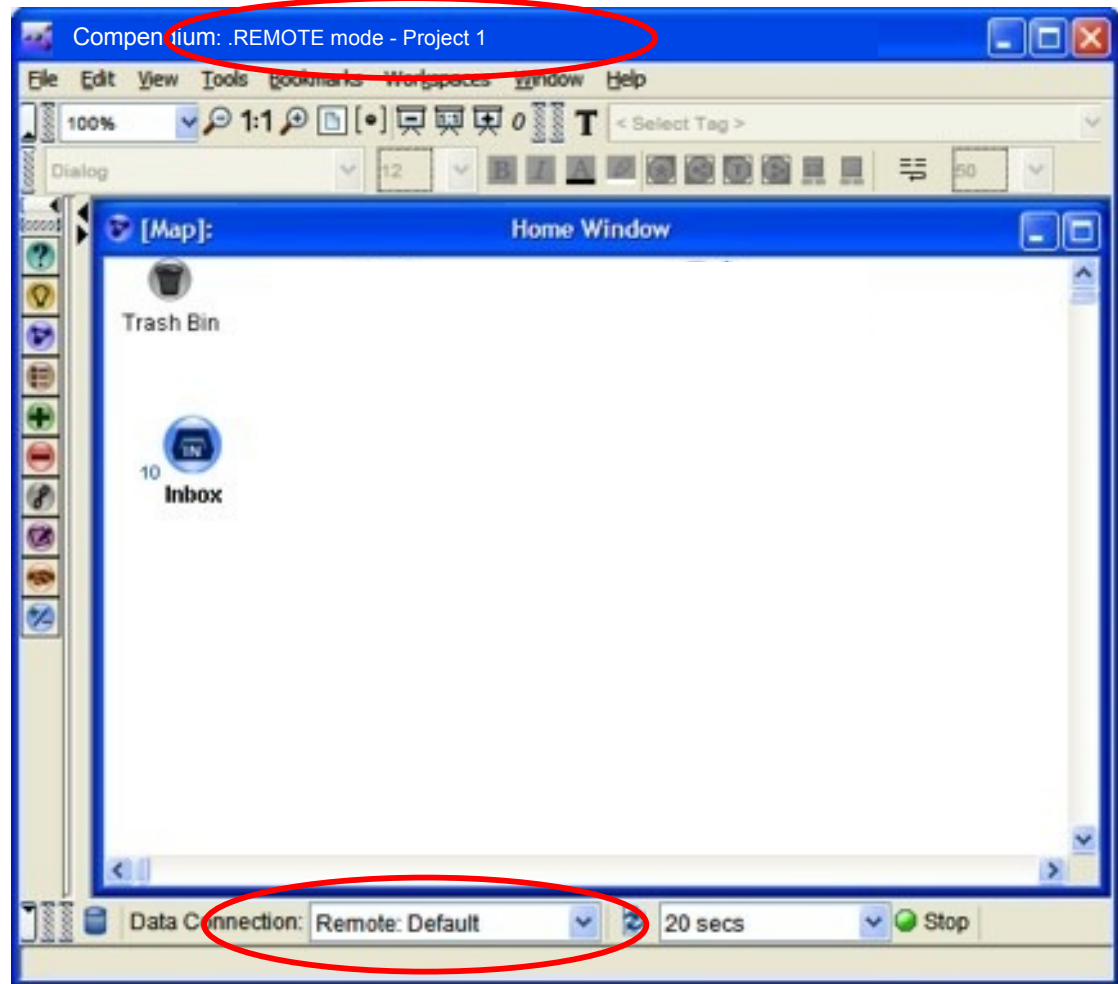
Starting Remote Mode - cont

- This dialog will be displayed
 - If it is not, go to the File menu and select Open
- Select the project that says REMOTE mode
- Enter your usual login information (which may be automatically filled in)



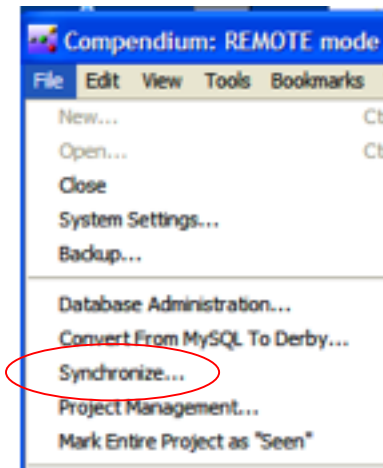
Using Remote Mode:

- In Remote Mode
 - Title will read **Compendium: REMOTE mode** - <project name>
 - Data Connection will say **Derby: Default**
- Compendium operates normally, using your personal copy database
- **No one sees the work you do unless you sync!**



Synchronization

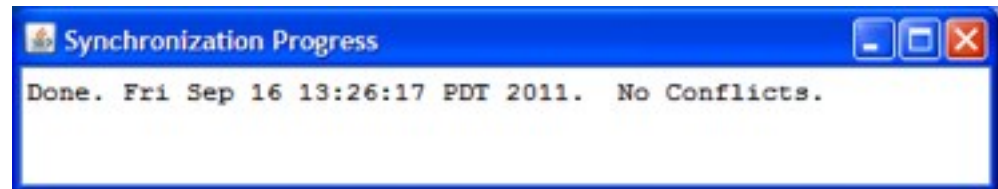
- To synchronize, you must...
 1. have a working LAN or VPN connection
 2. Be using Remote mode in C-PE
- To start a synchronization, go to the File menu, and then select Synchronize



Note: If the Synchronize menu entry is gray, you are not in Remote mode! Close C-PE, and log in again, in Remote mode.

Synchronization - cont

- Click [Yes] to Sync: REMOTE mode ... message
- Close [x] the Synchronization Progress dialog when it says Done.
- Once you have sync'd, you can disconnect from the LAN or VPN and use C-PE in Remote Mode





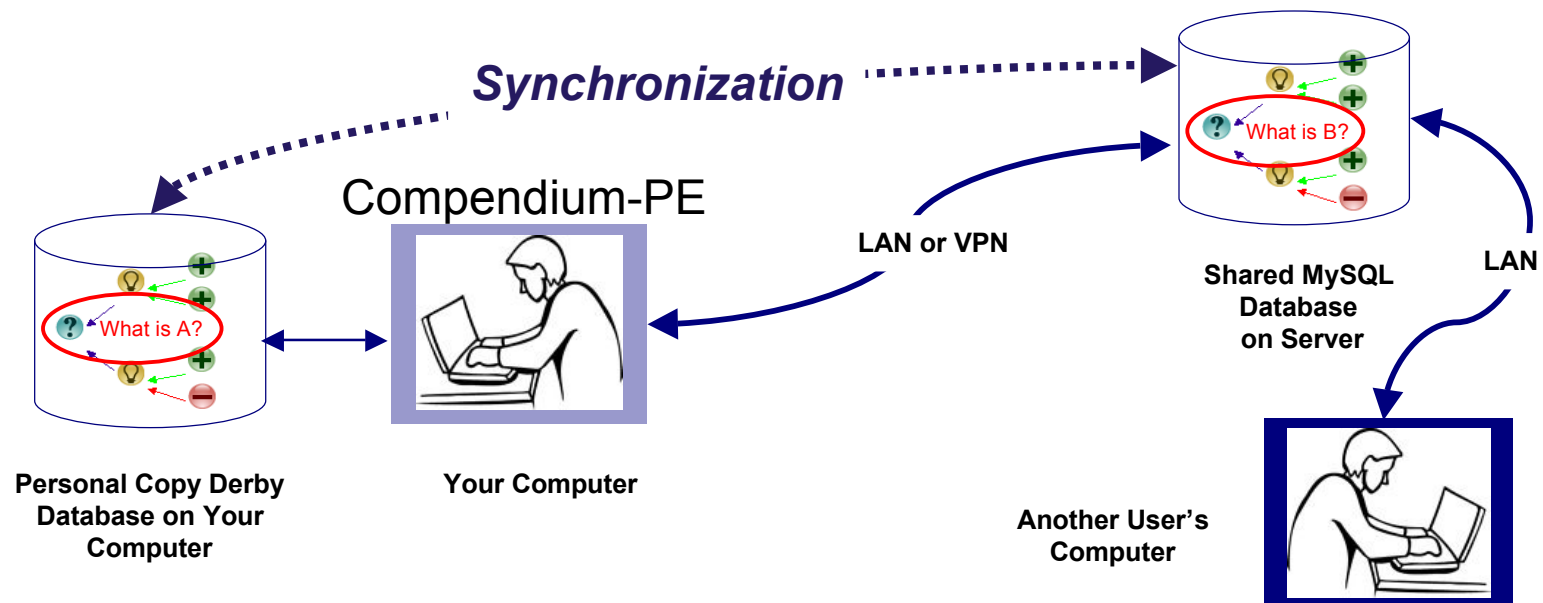
Synchronization Tip

- If you are going on a trip and there's a chance that you won't have an Internet connection along the way or when you arrive, you should Sync before you leave
- To sync before you leave
 - Start C-PE
 - Log into Remote mode
 - Synchronize
 - Exit C-PE

Special Situation: Conflicts in Synchronization

■ What is a conflict?

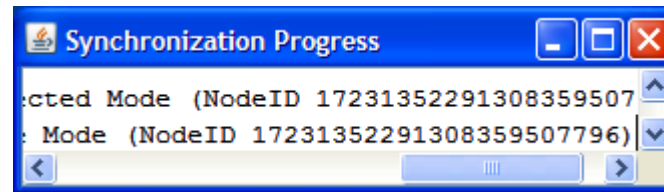
- On the rare occasion when two (or more) users make changes to the same node, a conflict can occur



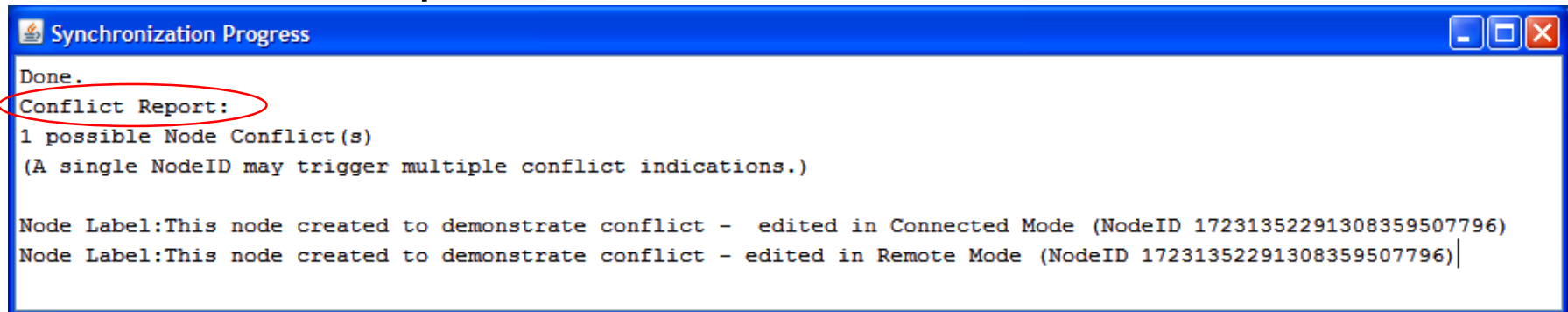
Conflicts in Sync - continued

- How do you know a conflict occurred?
 - Synchronization will produce a conflict report

- What will you see?
Something like this:



- Click and drag the lower right corner to expand so that the whole report is visible:





Conflicts in Sync - continued

- The Conflict Report still needs some work to be really usable. However, this is a low priority issue as 'in real life' we have seen few conflicts.



Conflicts in Sync - continued

- What happens when there is a conflict?
 - If one person made a change to a node in Connected mode, and another made a change to the same node in Remote mode, the change made by the person in Connected mode is retained
 - The change made to the same node in Remote mode will be “lost”
 - If both people were working in Remote mode, and changed the same node, the change made by whoever sync'd first will be retained
 - The change made to the same node by the 2nd person to sync will be “lost”
